# Area 4 - Cargile North

A large crowd attended the *Annual HOBO meeting* at the Clanton Alabama Power Building November 18. We all enjoyed listening to our *Coosa River Keeper Executive Director*, Justinn Overton, share many interesting & informative topics along with a slide show. The organization's mission is to protect, restore and promote the Coosa River and its tributaries in Alabama. They monitor polluters and their pollution permits; patrol the waterways by boat, on foot and in the air; educate the public; and advocate on behalf of the river and the folks who use it.

**Did you know in 2022 the Coosa River became the Fifth Most Endangered River in the U.S.???** Too many nutrients within a body of water can lead to an excess of growth weeds, and especially algae. A *harmful Algae Bloom (HAB*) can fill the water with algae specific toxins. These toxins are dangerous and can negatively impact the health of plants, fish, animals, and even humans!

In addition, *millions of tons of chicken feces* from billions of chickens is a major threat to the Coosa River's drinking water supply and overall ecosystem health. The waste is spread on fields, and massive industrial poultry farms discharge their wastewater in municipal sewer systems that are crumbling and where permits to protect water quality are inadequate or never enforced.

Justinn also addressed concerns of the *Coosa Graphite Project*. The mining of the Coosa Graphite Deposit is slated to begin in 2028, and construction began at the processing plant this year. This brings MANY CONCERNS about water pollution, air pollution, noise, and threatened & endangered species. It is critical for all of us to participate in the public comment period of the permitting process to reduce and mitigate impacts to the land, air and water in Coosa & Chilton Counties and in our river!

Please urge the Environmental Protection Agency to hold state agencies accountable for impairment issues that impact the Coosa River, local communities, biodiversity, recreation and quality of life.

#### SPECIAL NOTE FROM TREASURER JIMMY MCCORMICK -

When I write a check I like to know what the money is used for, you know, just where does it go?? Our checks to Alabama Power or to the Water Authority, well that's pretty clear, but donations, gifts, dues? Not so clear. We have a general idea of course and we feel it is going for a good cause. But for me, I want to know just EXACTLY how is my money going to be spent?

For most of our lake community, twenty five dollars is not much of a burden to our financial health. However; as your Treasurer I would like to tell you how your Board puts our collective dues to work.

We will start with the Association Mission Statement, and that is to Preserve, Protect, Improve. Our lake would not be what it is today if we did not Preserve, Protect, Improve our water quality.

We have an Environmental Committee that works with Alabama Power, Alabama Water Watch, the Coosa RiverKeeper, and other organizations to monitor what our watershed is filtering into our lake. We have Member Volunteers as water monitors testing the water at various parts of our lake. These testing kits are supplied by HOBO. (\$800+)

We also spend about \$800 a year on our semi-annual Lake Clean-Ups, where hundreds of us have shown up to go to designated spots throughout the lake to collect litter. And litter is described as fishing line and lures, bottles, cans, tires, mattresses, balls (foot, basket, tennis, soccer) and did I mention refrigerators? And oh yeah a goat. After we complete our mission we are all fed courtesy of your \$25. (No we did not eat the goat)

Your Association is also civic minded. We have a Scholarship Committee. This Committee works with school counselors, reviews applications, and interviews school seniors from Coosa and Chilton Counties who wish to apply for our scholarship. The winning applicants receive a \$2000 scholarship sent to the school of their choice to continue their education. Also as a result of the Poker Run (aka; the riverboat gamblers) we were able to send grants to seven Chilton and Coosa County schools for special education accommodations, playground equipment, band uniforms, library books, and a V5 Robotic brain. (ok I don't know what a Robotic brain is either but I'm pretty sure I need one)

We do our best to communicate, so we spent \$1200 to mail out meeting notices, clean-up announcements, picnic invitations, as well as the newsletter.

Every other year we spend about \$4000 to collect data, print, and mail our lake residence telephone books to mail to members. (more are available by request).

We are all about community. We have budgeted \$400 for Area Reps to communicate and have parties for their area members. And we spend hundreds to provide the meat, and supplies for the covered-dish Summer picnic held at the boat launch.

The largest community event we have surrounds the 4th of July. All can enjoy and any can participate in one of the two Independence Day parades. Hundreds of us line the shoreline to enjoy the party boat parade in the morning and the power boat parade in the afternoon. Around the 4th (date may very) after the sun goes down we all gather around the shoreline or ease our boats towards Cargile Creek to enjoy the Lake Mitchell Fireworks Show, which is the largest, private donation funded show in the State!!

We have a unique form of protection provided by our Fireboat, known as Marine 9, the designation given by the East Chilton County Fire and Rescue unit that mans the boat. I don't know of any other lake our size that can claim a boat this large, this fast, with as much on board lifesaving equipment as we do.

All of this for \$25 !!!!!!!!
And your organization has never had a debit, a loan, or a past-due bill.

You, the members, have donated thousands towards Marine 9, Fireworks, and Scholarships, as well as the other endeavors of HOBO. You have also purchased bags, shirts, and hats and have bought ads in the phone book etc. And you also volunteer.




### **Comments from Editor Laura Thornton:**
