FROM THE PRESIDENT

How excited I am about HOBO and your response! Six months from our beginning we are 220 members strong and growing. I would like to share with you some of our accomplishments. We have developed a mailing list of over 550 lake homes, formed a nonprofit corporation, elected officers and directors, established a budget, purchased a computer, published three newsletters, certified 15 water monitors, acquired 8 water test kits, divided the lake into 15 areas and secured a rep for each. following committees are at work: Security, Fire/Rescue, Clean up, Picnic, Water testing, and Fish We have established research. communication with 8 other lake ADEM. Alabama associations. Water Watch, Rivers Network. Auburn University, EPA and others.

We have acquired from ADEM the most current test results for Lake Mitchell water quality, fish tissue, and for all dumping permits. Our water monitors will complete their first test and submit a report by March 31.

If you have joined HOBO and have not been personally thanked, it is only because we have been so busy getting organized. You are very much appreciated and a big **THANK YOU** from all the officers and directors. As we move forward in our effort to preserve, protect, and improve Lake Mitchell, we need your help. Whatever your talent and time will permit you are needed. Come join us, "Mitchell Matters!"

FIRST HOBO MEETING

The first general meeting of HOBO will be at Clanton Alabama Power large auditorium on Saturday before Memorial Day, May 24, at 6:00 p.m. Please make plans to attend. We are so excited about the progress that has been made in these first few months, especially the 217 memberships. We need your support and input as we decide the direction and goals of this organization.



Water monitoring for all the main tributaries entering Lake Mitchell began in March with eight sites. The sites and monitors are: Blue Creek, Gordon Beene; Main river south of Cargile Creek, Jim Woodrow; Cargile Creek, Tim Watley and Dan Murchison; Bird Creek, Robin Cagle

and Sue Abernathy; Walnut Creek, Wayne Hardy; Cove Branch to the Lay Dam, Wayne Caton; Upper Hatchett and Weogufka, Edsel Hughes; Pennymotley, Sam Piccolo. Pat Crocker, "Bo" Austin and Sam Moorer will become certified monitors in the near future. Sam Piccolo is serving as chairman of this committee. Monthly testing results will be sent to Auburn University for computation. Watch for regular reports of results in the newsletter.

BOATING RULES OF THE ROAD

- 1. Boats passing head-on keep to the right.
- 2. When boats are crossing at right angles the boat on the left will yield right of way to the other boat.
- 3. Boats overtaking another boat may pass on either side but must grant right of way to the boat being overtaken.
- 4. Boats will not change course without first determining that it can be safely done without risk of collision.
- 5. Boats approaching a launch or pier shall yield right of way to a departing boat.
- 6. Boats departing the shoreline or a tributary shall yield right of way to through traffic and boats approaching.
- 7. When an operator fails to fully understand the course of an approaching boat he must slow down immediately.
- 8. In a narrow channel boats will keep to the right of mid-channel.
- Boats yielding right of way shall reduce speed, stop, reverse, or alter course to avoid collision.
 Boats with right of way should hold course and speed.
- 10. Operator shall maintain a proper lookout

In addition a safe and courteous boater idles in and out of populated sloughs, maintains a safe distance from boats pulling skiers or from swimmers. Make sure navigation lights work properly and turn them on between sunset and sunrise. For more information pick up a copy of <u>AL Boating Law Highlights</u> from
